Additionally, there has been a major development with the Rehab Center. With costs continuing to escalate in Ukraine, and the cost of traveling, not to mention the proximity of the rehab center to the war region in Ukraine, Slavik decided to relocate the facility closer to Nikopol.

He also devoted a lot of time to building up the Ordjonikidze. a number of those people also attend services. He has returned to Poland, but will be returning in March.
