Serious financial situation

We have been blessed in the 12 years of doing this ministry of not having to send out financial pleas very often. Along the way there were periods where we weren't able to do so and God always provided with generous one time donations right when we needed.

The church in Ukraine finds itself in a difficult situation right now. They are trying to support a rehab facility which has been the backbone ministry for the church for two years. They also are supporting three men who minister diligently. It is amazing that they can do this on about \$1200 per month. Unfortunately, in the year we have been back, support for the Nikopol church has waned. Though I no longer take a salary for the ministry, funds are still below budget. The economics of a war torn Ukraine simply do not allow the church to survive on the tithes and offerings of the members, which mainly cover the building, utilities, and some benevolence.

We know that there are many congregations in the U.S. that have their own very real financial difficulties, and we do not want to overburden those who have faithfully given over the years, yet we do need to find support for this ministry soon. We are down to only a small core of congregations who regularly donate to this work. The good news is that the low overhead makes it easy to finance. To address this need, I have recently register Nikopol Evangelism Inc. officially, and we have an EIN. We are now awaiting registration as a 501(c)(3) tax exempt organization. As soon as that is processed we can set up online giving to make it easier to

The recent decisions to end the fruitless study in Ordjo, and to move of the rehab closer to Nikopol have given Slavic more time to concentrate on other areas. One new effort is a regular study in Krasnogrivorivna, where a number of members live.

It was around the same time that Dennis met, taught, and baptized Slavic into Christ. Diana passed away several years after that, and Dennis returned to the US. On Saturday's Slavic goes there to help instructing young men in the church.

Another effort that has developed is involvement with other churches in the area. Slavic has helped out with a youth/family camp in Dnepropetrovsk, and some of our kids and adult members attended the camp -this year.

Last year, we introduced our Eugene to Zhenya, who is an avid bicycler and intellectual. The two became friends and had a number of bible studies, but tailed of towards the end of the year. Zhenya finds himself potentially in some legal trouble, and has returned to the one source of stability in his life, Eugene. Pray that god uses the situation for the best.
