Construction

Once the weather turned nice, Vova has turned his efforts more towards construction, though he still preaches. Along with some of the men from the rehab center, the building has moved along. so far, the floor has been poured, and the block wall has started to be laid. In Ukraine, there is a product called Gasblock, which is a solid concrete block that is lightweight due to being injected with air, which makes it a great insulator. They believe that the shell and roof of the building should be done, and then they can work on the interior in fall/winter.

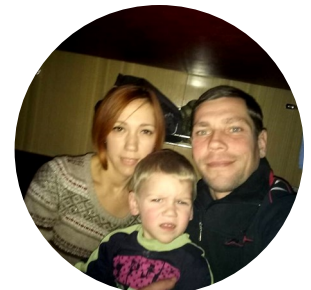
